## Academic Progress

Third quarter report cards were recently distributed on Monday, May 3. Parent conferences and interim distribution are two events to assist you with monitoring your child's progress. Parent conferences will be held Thursday, May 20. As we move toward the conclusion of the 2009 - 10 school year this is a good time to be in close contact with your child's teachers and guidance counselor. I encourage you to call/email the appropriate personnel to share any concerns you have regarding your child's progress.

## Special Transfers/Shared Domicile

If you are requesting a special permission transfer for an incoming 9th grade student the application must be filed between April 1— June 1, 2010. Please contact the administrative secretary, Mrs. Travis, at (410)887-1217 for the appropriate forms. Families filing for shared domicile must renew each year, please contact Mrs. McDonald in the guidance office if you plan to renew.

## High School Assessments (H S A)

Students must take and **PASS** all 4 H S A exams. Testing opportunities are provided in April for seniors (only), in May and again in the early fall. If your child has not met this requirement it is imperative that you remain in contact with his/her counselor: Mr. Lubinski, Ms. Attar or Ms. Price to make arrangements for the necessary interventions to ensure his/her success. Students who do not meet this requirement **WILL NOT GRADUATE**.

## Service Learning Hours

Required Service Learning Hours: Now is an excellent time to continue working on earning your hours. Your total will be printed on your report card, which will be mailed home. I urge you to contact Mr. Keith Johnson, Service Learning Coordinator, as you work to complete your required 75 service hours! Class of 2010, seniors, will **NOT** graduate without completing this Maryland requirement.

## Edline – Pilot Program

In the coming months, watch for changes to our school website to include a partnership with Edline, a web based communication application. As a pilot school we will be able to post teacher web pages, have online communication and upload grades for account holders (students and parents). Parents will have one login and will be able to access information about their children attending Pikesville High and Pikesville Middle.

## Cell Phones, iPods, and Electronic Devices

### **NOTE: UPDATED RETRIEVAL PROCEDURE**



The *BCPS Student Handbook* states that all electronic devices must be turned off and stored in the locker, book bag, automobile, or purse during school hours and while being transported on the bus. This includes the time between 7:30 a.m. when students enter the building until 2:15 p.m. We strictly adhere to



this policy. **If a student is found with a cell phone out during the day, it will be confiscated and logged into our safe. Parents will be sent a copy of the policy and will be able to retrieve the phone after 2:15 p.m. on the day it is confiscated.**

iPods are not to be on anytime during the school day including lunch. Earphones are also to be stowed in pockets or back packs.

Not only do these items distract from the instructional environment, but they are also targets for theft. If your child keeps a phone or iPod in a zippered section of his/her backpack, you can buy little locks for this section. We are not responsible for items stolen in the school. Most of our thefts are thefts of opportunity. Encourage students to keep their phones securely stored during the school day.

## Requirements for Passing to the Next Grade:

To pass GRADE 9, students must pass English 9 or social studies 9 and enough of their other classes to have earned at least 4 credits.

To pass GRADE 10, students must pass English 10 or social studies 10 and enough of their other classes to have earned at least 9 credits. Also, they must have passed English 9 and social studies 9.

To pass GRADE 11, they must have earned at least 13 credits during their first three years of high school, and they must be enrolled in all courses necessary to complete their graduation requirements

## Thinking about Summer School ?

**Summer School Courses** are for students who failed a course for the year. These courses are also for students who want to "speed up" their accumulation of credits and ,perhaps, qualify for a higher level course during the next school year. A student may take only one original credit course each summer. An original credit course will cost \$275

Registration for summer school will occur at PHS during May. Summer school courses will be taught at Owings Mills HS with a **very strict attendance policy**, so you would be wise to keep this in mind as you plan your vacation.

More information will be available from the counselors in May.

## Checklist for 4yr College-Bound JUNIORS:

- With the help of your counselor, determine which college entrance exam is the right one for you. The ACT is the best test for many students; the SAT is for others. See your counselor if you need help.
- Register for the ACT or the SAT if you plan to take either of these in the spring. But, for either test, you are strongly advised to register ASAP since everything is done on a "first come--first served basis." This is especially important if you prefer one test center over another.
- Remember that college entrance exams are NOT intelligence tests. Instead, they are tests of how much you prepared for them. **No one should ever take one of these exams without a lot of preparation and practice.**
- If you're planning to apply to a military academy, now is the time to contact your congressman or senator or both.

# Commencement

The Countdown to Commencement has officially begun! Over the past few weeks, seniors have verified the spelling of their names, and diplomas have been ordered. At this time, no further changes will be made to a diploma unless the diploma comes back from the printer with errors.

Seniors participating in the commencement ceremony must wear a cap and gown. Students who need to order a cap and gown should place their order directly with Balfour, ASAP, in order to ensure that their cap and gown will arrive in time for graduation. Balfour can be contacted via email [[www.balfour.com](http://www.balfour.com)] or via phone [410 321-4433].

Each graduate will receive 7 complimentary tickets to the commencement for his/her family and invited guests; 2 additional tickets may be purchased @\$5.00 per ticket. Additional ticket availability will be on a first-come-first-serve basis. Send a written request and payment (check made out to Pikesville High School or cash for the exact amount) for the additional tickets to Mrs. Adess, the Graduation Coordinator, in a sealed envelope with the student's full name and homeroom written on the front of the envelope. Please note that a ticket is required for each family member and guest attending the commencement ceremony including young children, toddlers and infants.

The graduation rehearsal and commencement will be held on Wednesday, June 2<sup>nd</sup> at Towson Center, Towson University. The rehearsal will begin promptly at 7:55a.m. and should last until 9:45a.m. Transportation to and from Towson University will not be provided. Seniors should allow sufficient time to drive to Towson during rush hour traffic, park their car and enter the Arena by 7:55a.m. Attendance throughout the entire rehearsal is mandatory for all seniors participating in commencement.

The commencement ceremony will begin promptly at 7:00p.m. Graduating seniors should plan to arrive between 5:45 – 6:15p.m. Please allow sufficient time in rush hour traffic to drive to Towson and park your car. Seniors must be in their assigned robing room by 6:15p.m. Final attendance will be taken at 6:30p.m. Students absent during the final attendance will not participate in the commencement ceremony. Their diplomas will be removed from the stage and may be picked up at the end of the ceremony.

Graduating seniors are expected to dress appropriately for the occasion. Ladies should wear a light colored skirt and top/dress and dressy sandals/shoes. Gentlemen should wear a pair of slacks, a buttoned shirt, tie, shoes, and socks. Bring only your cap and gown to the commencement ceremony. Ladies may also bring the white collar for their gown and its fasteners if they want to wear the collar.

Graduating seniors are expected to demonstrate appropriate behavior throughout the commencement ceremony. Students participating in the ceremony will only receive their diploma on stage if their behavior befits the occasion. In the event of inappropriate student behavior, the diploma will remain on stage and be brought back to school. A parent or guardian will need to come to school to pick up the diploma from Mrs. Adess or Mr. Whatley from 8:45a.m. – 9:20a.m. and 2:15p.m. – 3:00p.m. during subsequent school days.

Doors into the Commencement Hall open at 6:00p.m. for parents and invited guests. Doors close for parents and invited guests at 6:45p.m. Parents and guests arriving after this time will be allowed to enter the hall after the processional. Shuttle buses will be available from the satellite parking lots. The last shuttle bus scheduled to arrive at the Arena before 6:45, will leave the parking lot at 6:30p.m.

Handicapped seating is available. One family member may accompany the handicapped guest into the Arena fifteen minutes before the doors open to the general public.

The ceremony will last approximately 1 hour and 15 minutes. At the completion of the ceremony, all guests should remain in their seats until the faculty and graduates have processed out of the Arena. After the recessional, graduates will meet their parents and invited guests on the patio outside the Towson Center.

Towson has requested that we make the following announcements:

- In order to be fair to all guests, each family member in attendance may reserve one seat. If two people arrive at 6:00, two seats may be reserved.
- Parents and guests should refrain from removing seat covers that reserve seats for faculty chaperones.
- Parents and guests should plan to take photographs from their seats within the Arena. During the ceremony, the aisles must remain clear to comply with fire laws.
- Balloons and Food/Beverages other than bottled water are not permitted in the Arena.

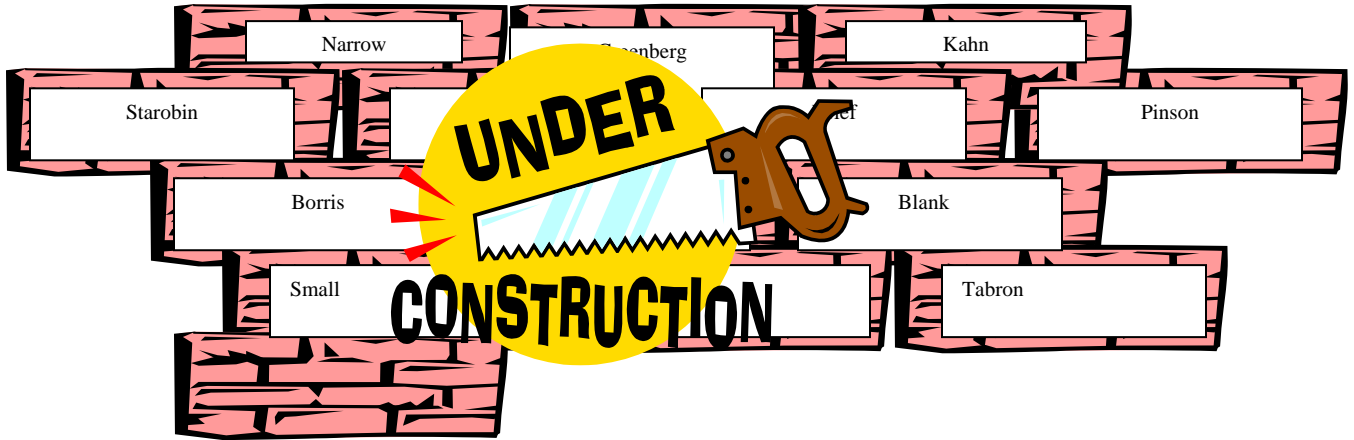
